Rosali Collier:

Leelanau 4-H Babysitting Club: We still have a couple of spots left in our babysitting club that starts this Saturday in Suttons Bay. Open to 6th-8th grade students. Saturdays, January 11, 18, 25 and February 15, 22, and 29. The first 3 sessions cover the CPR/First Aid training and certification, and the final three cover ages, stages, tips, and practice. You may pay your participation fee directly through your county Extension office (credit card, cash, or check). Remember, being in 4HOnline means that you are an active member, and are covered under our MSU liability.

OLD BUSINESS:

2020 Budget: We need to approve the 2020 budget that was passed out in November. Gretchen Sauvage made a motion to approve the 2020 budget, Cliff Wares 2nd the motion. Approved.

SPECIE CHAIR UPDATES:

<u>Steer</u> – Had a great turn out for Winter Beef Classic at MSU in December. Watch your steers/heifers for sickness. Keep water unfrozen. Possession date is January 1st. Registrations are due tonight by midnight.

<u>Dairy Feeder</u>: Registration is due at the March meeting. Calves must be born after Jan. 1^{st} and possession by March 1^{st} . Watch for sickness.

<u>Junior Beef</u>: Calves must be born after Feb. 1st. Registrations are due at the March meeting. Possession by May 15th. Make sure you get on farm lists now. Stay away from livestock sales as Jr. Beef must be 100% beef. Record books are being updated. Education credit – Vet Science and Beef Sheep Swine workshops at Kettenun February 21st. It's a great weekend!

<u>Swine</u>: Registrations are due at the February meeting. Forms must be filled out completely and make sure to complete the leader form. May 1st is possession date.

<u>Sheep</u>: Start looking for lambs now they must be born after January 1st. See Nancy if you need any help. <u>Goat</u>: Registrations are due March 2nd. Goats must be born after Nov. 1st. If you need one get with Beth as she has some options. Breed goats must be 4 months old by fair. Possession date is May 1st. Sooner you get them the better they will be by fair.

<u>Rabbit/Cavy</u>: Roosters bred by end of this week. Registrations are due at the May meeting. Watch for sicknesses.

<u>Poultry</u>: Production hens possession date is January 31st. Registrations are due at the March meeting. Show birds you need by April 15th. Call Lynn if you have any questions.

<u>Llama/Alpaca</u>: Make sure you worm your animal. There will be some workshops coming up. For those looking to enhance their llama/alpaca knowledge and to have some fun, please check out the up and coming clinics and events on the Fehrenbach Farms web page. Denise Fehrenbach has lined up some top camelid veterinarian speakers and judges from across the country to come to us to share what they know about parasites, fecal testing, training and handling, showing and spinning fiber for beginners. Sign up and get ready to learn! Also, in the works is a llama/alpaca hike. Watch their website to learn more.

<u>Dog</u>: Registrations are due at the June meeting. Keep your dogs warm. February is dental month, good time to clean their teeth.

<u>Horse</u>: Jeopardy – Feb. 23rd @ Michigan Works. Tack sale is tentative March 21st, not set in stone yet, more info to come. Boot Camp is May 16-17th at the Fair. Registrations are due at the May meeting <u>Differently Abled</u>: no report

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

<u>Workbee</u> – Dates are May 2nd, May 13th, June 16th & July 29th Will be doing a sign-up genius again and it will be posted on facebook. Everyone is required to do 2 hours again.

NEW BUSINESS:

Registration forms are on the website. Steer/heifers are due tonight by midnight. Swine are due at the February meeting. March is junior beef, dairy feeder, lamb, goat & poultry. May – Llama, horse & rabbit. Dog registration is due at the June meeting.

Teen Reps – would love to welcome them to the board. We just need a one-page letter of interest – why you would like to be a teen rep and email it to the board. They will be due January 17th so we can have them by the February meeting.

Education – Big changes – but everyone will still be required to do 2. We are putting together mini expos. They will be one day or a weekend that way you can get your credits all at once. We are working on a MSU trip via bus to MSU to tour some of their facilities. Learn about species. This would be a one-day event – 2 credits. We will need chaperones. Details will be coming. Looking at early spring – May. There will be no swine visits, but maybe we can get an educator to speak to us.

Great Wolf Lodge – mini expo March 7th or 8th – looking for a vote. It will be a one-day event. You will be required to attend 2 sessions. We plan to start at 9am. We will have speakers in the morning and afternoon with 2-3 sessions at a time. To receive education credit, it must be a 4-H sanctioned event or it needs to be signed off on by the Livestock Council Board. We will post the schedule when we have it. It was agreed to have the Great Wolf Lodge mini expo on Sunday, March 8th. Great Wolf Lodge may offer a discount on rooms, you would need to contact them. There is no charge to attend the expo as the Livestock Council will be paying for it. More info to come. There will be no education sessions before the regular monthly council meetings.
