2. Tanner Building and Cloverbud Activities during Fair Week

- a. **Club Booths**: We are still taking registrations for club booth displays. Clubs are encouraged to develop and display club booths that promote "Education and Outreach." Booths will compete for certificates such as most creative, most organized, etc. and the overall winner will win a Little Caesars Pizza gift card for their 4-H club as well as a Best Club Booth Display ribbon. - b. **4-H Clover Award**: This award is open to youth ages 10-19 in Grand Traverse, Leelanau, Kalkaska, Benzie and Antrim counties. Written applications are due by Wednesday, August 4th, and interviews for finalists will take place Monday, August 9th, between 11 and 3 in the Tanner Building. The winner will be recognized with a \$100 VISA card and a ribbon at the Saturday Awards Celebration. The fillable PDF form is available on the Livestock Council website. Paper copies are here for you to take with you tonight.
- c. **Judged Projects:** These may be submitted prior to 2 pm on Saturday, August 7 and will be displayed as individual 4-H projects in an area of the Tanner Building. These projects can be entered in any class outlined in the Northwestern Michigan Fair Premium book 4-H Still Exhibit section (pages 65-66). Entries will be awarded judged feedback. We will be giving out first, second, and third place ribbons in each of the nine classes. Cloverbuds may also submit entries for the chance to win a participation ribbon. Interviews with any youth wishing to talk to judges will take place between 11 and 3 on Monday of Fair in the Tanner Building. This includes Cloverbuds.
- d. **Cloverbud activities and crafts** will be offered throughout the week, and will be held in or just outside the Tanner Building. These activities will be offered as a make and take, or just as a take and make later to families. Kathy Swinney and a committee of clubs and other volunteers are making this happen all week. We will be offering times in the morning each day of Fair (Monday through Friday) and also during the designated cloverbud activity time from 2 to 4 each day. The Cloverbud Games Day will take place on Saturday the 14th at 4:00 pm at the DA Tent. Watch for more information on this.
- e. **Leelanau 4-H Youth Association Fundraiser:** The Leelanau 4-H Youth Association will be selling a handful of 4-H caps and Leelanau County 4-H t-shirts on Sunday, August 8 and Monday, August 9 in the Tanner Building, from 10-noon. The funds raised will go toward youth scholarships.
- f. **Grand Traverse 4-H Leaders Council Fundraiser:** The Council will be selling 4-H branded items periodically throughout the week in the Tanner Building.
