FAIRBOARD NEWS: Frank Guerin

New Bleachers have been ordered and should arrive in 6-8 weeks! We will be able to increase our seating capacity by 50%. Our goal is to sell out Friday night Demo Derby and Saturday night Rodeo, but with a lot more people. The new Jr. Beef wash rack is underway, and the old

equipment is out of there. The tree will be removed and we will get the concrete sorted out. Clarissa has a new Junior Homemaker program happening in the Evelyn Heim building. This will be similar to the adult program as far as entry requirements, along with a short essay and questions. Any boy or girl ages 5 to 17 years old can register. Benzie County (Ali Olson) –

We have a Dog Rally and Obedience spin club that starts Wednesday (3/6) at Pleasant Valley Community Center and that's open to 4H youth ages 12-19 years old. You can register for this class at 4H online under the events tab. If you have any questions or are interested in signing up you can see me after the meeting and I'm happy to help. For the Benzie County clubs - I will not be at fair this year, so if you want a club booth let's chat and get that figured out. For the upcoming Exploration Days, we are looking for chaperones for the Benzie County youth.

Leelanau County (Rosali Collier) –

4-H Expo: I first want to give a big shoutout to our Council Board: our officers, species chairs, assistants, and our awesome 4-H Teen Reps. Yesterday was a fantastic experience, and I loved seeing everyone come together to provide that wonderful learning opportunity.

Tanner 4-H Exhibit Building: We will be offering a more competitive club booth display competition with the top three booths: \$100, \$75, and \$50 VISA gift cards to the first, second, and third place winners. This year's theme for the club booth displays is "Oh, The Places You'll Go with 4-H!". Every club can show what makes their club unique and how taking part in 4-H leads to amazing things. Please see the Exhibits Information packet with the Club Registration Form. Those can be turned into the Grand Traverse or Leelanau 4- H offices. We will have a fillable form on the Livestock Council website, as well.

4-H Tractor Safety: Leelanau 4-H will host an in-person 4-H Tractor Safety Program for 14 and 15-year-old youth on Sundays, May 5, May 19, and June 2 from 3:00-5:00 pm at the NW MI Horticulture Research Center (between Suttons Bay and Traverse City on County Rd 633). The written and driving test will be held in-person, by appointment, on Sunday, June 9 between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. Rain date will be Saturday, June 15. Participants must attend all four days to become certified. The cost is \$60 per student, which includes the classes, manual, certificate, and snack on testing day. Scholarships are available if finances are an issue. Youth must be 14 years of age by June 1, 2024. Space is limited to 20 youth. The registration deadline is April 26, 2024. Registration is online-only in a two-step process. First, register and pay at <https://events.anr.msu.edu/TractorSafety2024/> , and second, become a 4-H member with Leelanau County and create a family account online at <https://v2.4honline.com/> choosing the Tractor Safety program as their club. Once registered, participants will receive more information about signing up for the testing day. Leelanau 4-H Babysitting Club: Open to all youth in grades 6th-8th, and limited to a class size of 20, the club will meet on four Sundays, April 7, 14, 21, and 28, from 1-4:00 pm at the Suttons Bay Bingham Fire and Rescue Station. Cost is \$30, which includes the First Aid/CPR certification fee, snacks, and materials. Youth will learn about how children develop, safety while babysitting, ways to entertain children of different ages and stages, and about the business of babysitting. Youth will receive materials and a First Aid/CPR Certificate from the

American Heart Association after completion of the club. NEW BUSINESS

a. Heather Barley Scholarship (Mark Barley)

Applications are out and available on the website for Seniors.

This year again we will be offering \$6500, \$4500, and \$2500.

Requirements = min 2.5 GPA, 4-H member for 3 consecutive years, enrolled as a Senior in High School for 2023-2024 school year, must graduate and receive High School Diploma or equivalent.

Payments will be made to the institution they will attend for either their 1st or 2nd year. Money shall be used toward tuition, room/board, class books, etc.

DEADLINE – May 6th. Applications can be dropped off to the MSU Extension office in GT or brought to the Livestock Council Meeting.

Recipients of the Scholarship will be announced at the Awards Ceremony at the 2024 NWMI Fair.

More education opportunities to come, so keep an eye on your email and FB page. One more thing, be sure to take your health form with you when you go to pick up your project from the breeder. That way you can get all the necessary information. Email updates will start once I receive my final

numbers tonight. I will not be resigning from my position as Goat Specie Chair with the new position as GT Coordinator. I verified with MSU before I even applied, that I would still be able to be the Goat Specie Chair as well. Thank you.

March and April are the months where projects start to be brought home. Be sure you are working with your breeder to ensure you have an 840 tag in your swine's ear. This is the breeder's job to place that tag in the ear for you. Also be sure to prep your animals home with adequate shelter, bedding, feed and watering systems. It is really too cold still in March and April for our little piggies, so make sure you have some heat lamps to keep them warm. Policies and procedures for the swine barn are on the website.

Remember you need to have 2 education credits and one workbee. Possession date is May 1st. We will be doing virtual tagging again this year, so that link will be coming out in the next couple of weeks as I prep that document.
